Novosibirsk is the only settlement along the Trans-Siberian Railway that has grown into a city with a population of over one million inhabitants. The excursion covers the main attractions of the city, including: the railway station, the largest on the Trans-Siberian Railway; Krasny Prospekt, one of the longest straight streets in the world (7 km); Lenin Square, the city center, featuring the Opera and Ballet Theatre, the largest in the world after the Teatro Colón in Buenos Aires; historic wooden houses on Gorky Street, the oldest part of the city; St. Nicholas Chapel, marking the geographical center of the former Russian Empire; the embankment of the Ob River, the seventh-longest river in the world; the picturesque Siberian agricultural market. <p>10. SUNDAY</p>	<p>Breakfast at the hotel. Visit to the Academic Town, including the ethnographic and archaeological museum. Excursion to the scientific city of Akademgorodok (30 km from the center of Novosibirsk). It is a unique scientific town where all branches of science are represented. Akademgorodok is sometimes referred to by European media as the "Scientific Vatican." In 1957, during the Cold War, Nikita Khrushchev and the Soviet mathematician Mikhail Lavrentiev founded a special city for scientific research called Akademgorodok, meaning "academic town." It was built near Novosibirsk, in a forested area, and leading Soviet scientists were invited to relocate there. Today, Akademgorodok is a beautiful town that is home to Novosibirsk State University, several academies, and 35 scientific research institutes. The community is far from factories and industrial plants and enjoys proximity to the Ob Sea, the reservoir created by the Ob River dam. You will enter Akademgorodok via Lavrentiev Avenue, listed in the Guinness Book of Records as the "most scientific street in the world." You will also see the Ob River reservoir (the artificial Ob Sea). Free time for lunch. Free time in Novosibirsk. Transfer to the railway station. Departure by train to Krasnoyarsk at 19:34. During the excursion, we will show you the most interesting sights of the city: Mira Square (Peace Square) with an exceptional view of the Yenisei River, the monument to Andrey Dubensky, and Karaulnaya Hill, from where you can see the entire city. You will also visit the Paraskeva Pyatnitsa Chapel and walk along the historic streets, learning the origins of their names and how the city has changed and grown over time. Free time for lunch. Visit to the "Stolby" Nature Reserve — the heart, lungs, and soul of the city. 16. SATURDAY	Breakfast at the hotel. Today we immerse ourselves in the world of Lake Baikal, full of hidden and fascinating details. At the Baikal Museum, you will learn about the origin of the lake, its unique flora and fauna. The experience is complemented by a model of a bathyscaphe diving to the lake's depths and an artistic display of the Baikal seal's movements. The final panoramic photo stop will be at the source of the Angara River, the only river flowing from Lake Baikal. Rising 728 meters above sea level, the guide will explain the difference between Chersky Stone and Chersky Mountain and share the story of the explorer Chersky. The culmination of the day is a visit to the Russian village from the 17th–19th centuries at the Taltsy Architectural and Ethnographic Museum. You will see village churches, peasant homesteads, a rural school, and local administration buildings. It feels as if time has stopped here, and the villagers are about to resume their daily activities. You will also learn about the culture of the Evenks, Tofs, and Buryats, the indigenous peoples of Siberia. Free time for lunch. Train journey to Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia: approx. 23 hours and 40 min, 517-1113km distance depending on the specific route. You will arrive at the Russian border at around 19:57. The process at each border take approximately 1h,40m. Just stay in your cabin. Immigration and custom officers will come and handle the border crossing process. Toilets will be locked during these border crossings. Then train will move into Mongolian side, and arrive at Mongolian border after 40 minutes. Same thing in Mongolian side (Sukhbaatar). <p>18. MONDAY</p>	<p>The train from Irkustk, Russia will arrive in Ulaanbaatar train station early in the morning at 6:38 AM. Meet with the Samar Magic Tours team at Ulaanbaatar Railway Station. Change some money on the way. Transfer to the hotel from Ulaanbaatar Railway Station (approx. + 1 hour depending on traffic). Clients must pay for early check-in (early entry to hotel rooms with breakfast). Rooms are only available from 2:00 PM (14:00) on the day of arrival. Panoramic city tour of Ulaanbaatar: visit the most important Buddhist Monastery in Mongolia, Gandan, which houses a 25-meter-tall Buddha. The Gandan Monastery was founded in 1809 under the name "Yellow Temple." It also holds a library containing the Buddhist scriptures of Gandjuur (8 volumes), their commentaries (225 volumes), and other texts inscribed with the 9 precious stones. It was declared a State Heritage site in 1994. Continue with visits to the National History Museum, with its rich collection of historical and cultural artifacts from the Stone Age to the present day; Sukhbaatar Central Square; and the "Genghis Khan" Monument Complex, built in 2006 to commemorate the 800th Anniversary of the Foundation of the Mongol State or Mongol Empire by Genghis Khan (1206–2006), located in front of the Mongolian Parliament and Government House. Welcome Lunch included in a traditional local restaurant. 06:00 PM – Enjoy a folklore performance of Mongolian singing and dance. Transfer to the hotel. Overnight at Holiday Inn hotel 5* or similar. 19. TUESDAY	<p>Breakfast at hotel. 08:00 AM – Meeting with the Samar Magic Tours team at the hotel reception. Departure northeast to the 40-meter / 133.3-foot Genghis Khan Equestrian Statue (55 km / 34.2 miles, approx. +2 hours, depending on traffic). The statue symbolically faces east towards his birthplace. It stands on top of the Genghis Khan Statue Complex, a visitor center 10 meters (32 ft 10 in) high, with 36 columns representing the 36 khans from Genghis Khan to Ligdan Khan. Visitors walk up to the horse's head through its chest and neck to enjoy a panoramic view. Nearby, travellers may take beautiful photos with Kazakhs and their Golden Eagles, ride Bactrian camels or Mongolian horses across the steppe, or try archery (*extra payment on-site). A traditional Mongolian lunch is included in route. Continue to Gorkhi-Terelj National Park (50 km / 31.1 miles, approx. 1hr). Located northeast at 1600 m above sea level, the park features towering Mesozoic granite formations, mountains, steppes, alpine forests, and iconic rock formations such as Turtle Rock. The Park lies at the foothills of the Khentii Mountains, the birthplace of Genghis Khan. Declared a National Park in 1993, it covers 300,000 hectares. Stop for photos, souvenir shopping, and a short walk to the Great Turtle Rock, symbol of the Gorkhi-Terelj National Park. Gentle hike to the Arryabal Meditation Temple, located on a hillside. Afterwards, return to Ulaanbaatar (70 km / 44 miles, approx. +2 hours, depending on traffic). Last chance for Mongolian souvenir shopping at the main State Department Store. Transfer to the hotel. Accommodation at the selected and confirmed hotel. Then, depart west for an Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show (35 km/22 miles, +2.00 hours travel time, depending on traffic at departure), from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show demonstrates the traditional lifestyle of Mongolian nomads, raising and using five types of livestock while moving from one place to another using ox carts, yaks, camels, and horses. We can also observe what a Ger looks like. The Mongolian Ger, one of the symbols of Mongolia, is traditionally made. All furniture, pots, and clothing are antiques, reflecting the characteristics and manners of the central Khalks. Mongolian traditional lunch is included on-site. Return to Ulaanbaatar (35 km/22 miles, +2 hours travel time, depending on traffic at the entrance). Transfer to the hotel. Overnight at your selected hotel. Train cabin usually set at room temperature (Air conditioned).

A 4-bed cabin (Kupe/Second Class) on the Moscow to Ulaanbaatar train offers a budget-friendly, authentic experience with two upper and two lower bunks, a small table, storage, and shared carriage facilities like a toilet, sink, and Samovar for hot water; while not luxurious, it's clean, provides bedding, and allows for social interaction, with the option to book all four bunks for more privacy.

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Cabin Features (Second Class/Kupe)

Bunks: Four berths (two lower, two upper) with ladders to reach the top bunks.

Space: Enough room for luggage under lower bunks and in overhead racks, plus a small table by the window.

Bedding: Clean sheets, pillows, duvets, and blankets are provided.

Privacy: A lockable door secures the compartment, though it's shared with three strangers unless you buy all four berths.

Power: Charging points are usually available near the window.

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SECURITY & SAFETY ON THE TRANS-SIBERIAN/TRANS-MONGOLIAN TRAIN

Is the trans-Siberian safe to travel?

Russia in particular still has a bit of an image problem with regards to personal safety. However, once in Russia, and particularly on the trains, most quickly realize that a Trans-Siberian trip is no more 'dangerous' than any rail trip in Europe or North America.

In Russia: On the trains your safety is a top priority for the Provodnik & Provodnitsas who look after your carriage and also for security staff who travel on the trains. If you keep your common-sense hat on you should not have any issues with theft.

Cabins can be locked from the inside by you or from the outside by the conductors on request. At train station stops you are usually only allowed to board the carriage you have a ticket for.

Perhaps the biggest risk is at the start or end of a train journey at the train stations – particularly arriving at stations. Do keep a good eye on your bags and pockets and this applies as much (if not more) to Ulaanbaatar station and all the big stations in Russia where large crowds are the norm.

In Mongolia: **Mongolia is a safe place for tourism**; there are no drugs, assaults, or weapons. However, as anywhere in the world, one must be cautious with pickpockets. It is recommended that upon arrival at the hotel you immediately place in the hotel safe (in the room or at reception): passport, visas, money, documents, valuables, etc., before going out for visits in Ulaanbaatar. Be careful in restaurants, pizzerias, cafés, markets, the central post office, and monasteries, where there are pickpockets.



MONEY & PAYMENTS ON THE TRANS-SIBERIAN/TRANS-MONGOLIAN TRAINS

1. With regard to money on trains there are the following general rules to take into account:

- Only count on being able to use local currency on the train and at stations – it is rare you can pay in USD or Euros these days.
- Don't count on finding any ATMs at the stations even if told they exist - they also currently won't take Western issued cards such as Visa and MasterCard.
- Bring enough money on to the train with you to get you to your next destination.
- Bring a little more than you think you will need!
- You can change money at the borders if you need to.
- You can change or obtain Russian Rubles or Tugriks in Mongolia.

2. Can I pay by card on the Trans-Siberian/Trans-Mongolian Trains?

Inside Russia it is now possible to pay by card on some trains and you can't currently use Western issued cards such as Visa and MasterCard in Russia.

However, as this is a new development there can be a reluctance to take a card payment – particularly from foreigners. For whatever reasons, cash is still insisted on. As payment by card becomes more commonplace, we hope this will change. As ever, if you are going to use a card make sure you let your bank know in advance where you will be travelling or they may put a block on your card.

Card payments on trains are not yet possible in Mongolia.

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FACT SHEET – MONGOLIA

Currency: The official currency in Mongolia is the Tugrik or Tugrug (T). It comes in banknotes of 10, 20, 50, 100, 500, 1,000, 5,000, 10,000, and 20,000 Tugrik. It is advisable to bring EUROS or USD and exchange them progressively. Currency exchange can be done at banks and hotels in Ulaanbaatar.

Climate: Known as the land of the blue sky, but its climate is extreme and severe. Siberian winters cover the Gobi Desert with snow until April and keep lakes frozen until May. The rainy season is short, from mid-July to September, with brief and light showers. Nights are cool even in summer.

Approximate temperatures in Mongolia:

Spring:	May	[around 14°C daytime, 6° °C nighttime. Occasional rain, generally cool.]
Summer:	June-August	[28–30 °C daytime, 18 °C nighttime. Mostly dry with occasional rain.]
Autumn:	September.	[21–16 °C daytime, 0 °C nighttime. Dry and cold.]

Luggage: The lighter the luggage, the better. A soft backpack or travel bag is recommended, plus a small daypack for essentials during the day (camera, skin and lip cream, binoculars, canteen, and flashlight). A raincoat or poncho and a good parka, warm clothes for high places, light cotton clothes, sunglasses, and a cap for midday heat, as well as comfortable footwear, are recommended. Clients are advised to bring binoculars.

Small first-aid kit: mosquito repellent, saline solution, gauze, aspirin, paracetamol.

Electricity: 220V, 50Hz. European round plug.

Clothing: No special requirements regarding dress, just respect local customs.

Photography: The country is one of the most photogenic in the world, with its landscapes, wildlife, culture, and people. Entrance fees to museums, National Parks, and Monasteries are included in the trip according to the program, but photography is not. In many monasteries and temples, photos are not allowed unless you pay the set fee. Always check before taking photos, as notices are written in Cyrillic or Mongolian, often unintelligible for us; once you take a picture, payment is immediate.

Food: The basis of food in Mongolia is meat. Lamb and flour form the base of most meals. The Mongolian diet also includes horse meat. Milk and yogurt have an exquisite

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though strong flavor. Cow and goat cheese are common.

Milk may not be pasteurized, and some dairy products can therefore be unsafe. It should be boiled, and foods should preferably be consumed cooked. This is the health guideline, but in reality, once you stop at a Ger, guests are always invited to enter and offered aromatic *airag* (fermented mare's milk) and goat, yak, or sheep cheese, all acidic and dry. Refusing would not be polite.

Shopping: Bargaining is not common in Mongolia. Even bargaining, you won't usually pay less than 70% of the asking price. Some shops offer handicrafts, postcards, and clothing. Also available are carpets, leather and fur products, as well as cashmere and camel hair items. Wooden toys, puzzles, and games, along with oil paintings and watercolors. In the capital's stores, European products are available—expensive, especially in the State Department Store and other new shopping centers—which carry almost anything you may want, both Mongolian and foreign.
