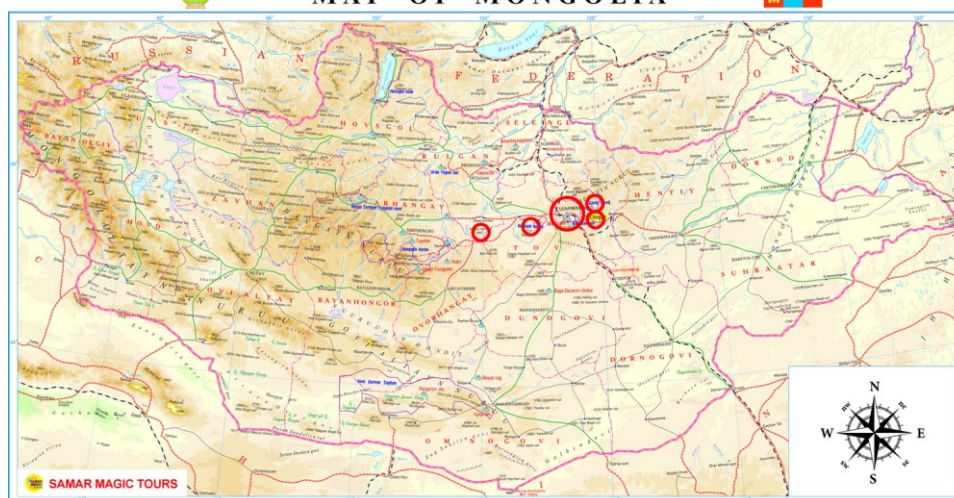

TOUR DESCRIPTION: We will begin the route at Ulaanbaatar's New "Genghis" Khan International Airport (inaugurated on July 3, 2021, located 52 km/32.3 miles away, approx. +2-3 hours' drive depending on traffic), capital of Mongolia, with a warm welcome from the **Samar Magic Tours** team. This is one of the most fascinating routes in Mongolia. Next, we will depart **northeast** to visit the **Equestrian Statue of Genghis Khan**, a stainless-steel monument standing 40 meters tall. At the base of the statue, visitors can see a replica of the legendary Golden Whip of the Great Khan. Tourists can take an elevator inside the statue. The exit is at the level of Genghis Khan's thigh, from where one can walk to the horse's head and enjoy a panoramic view of the steppe. We will also visit a small **Bronze Age Museum**, located in the basement of the statue. Departure continues **northeast** to **Gorkhi/Terelj National Park**, located 1,600 meters above sea level, with towering granite rocks from the Mesozoic era, mountains, steppes, alpine forests, and large rock formations of unusual shapes such as **Turtle Rock**. Declared a **National Park** in 1993, it covers an area of 300,000 hectares. Afterward, we will head **west** to attend an **Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show**, which demonstrates the traditional lifestyle of Mongolian nomads, including the herding and use of five types of livestock, moving from one place to another with ox carts, yaks, camels, and horses. We will then continue **westward** to **Karakorum (Central Mongolia)**, the former capital of the **Mongol Empire**, where "Genghis" Khan began construction in 1220 (later destroyed by Manchu soldiers). Here we will visit the **Monument to the Mongolian States**, built in 2004 on a hill overlooking **Karakorum (Kharkhorin)** and the **Orkhon River**. The monument features a large stone ovoos (shamanic cairn) with nine poles rising from its top, mounted on a stone and concrete platform, and surrounded by three circular walls. The outer walls are decorated with colourful mosaics depicting maps of three empires:



1. The **Xiongnu Empire**, a confederation of nomadic tribes inhabiting the steppe from the 3rd century BC to the 1st century AD.
2. The **Turkic Khaganate**, established by the Göktürks in 682 and lasting until 744.
3. Finally, the **Mongol Empire**, founded by Genghis Khan in the 13th century.

The site combines imperial symbolism with **shamanic traditions**. Offerings of vodka, milk, tea, rice, and other foods are often left at the **ovoo**, attracting birds and even passing herds of sheep and goats. Animal skulls can also be found scattered nearby, adding to the surreal atmosphere. Located in **Karakorum** (then the capital under **Ogedei Khan**, successor of **Genghis Khan**), this monument also provides a panoramic viewpoint over the Orkhon River valley.

Next, we will visit the **Erdene Zuu Monastery** (Hundred Treasures), the **Turtle Monument**, and the **Karakorum Museum to view relics of the Mongol Empire**. With its **108** stupas, walls, and temples, **Erdene Zuu** (built in the 16th century) **was the most important Buddhist lamasery**. Today, it remains a striking complex covering **400** square meters, surrounded by the steppe. Construction was continued by **Ogedei Khan after Genghis Khan's death**. Forty years later, **Kublai Khan (grandson of Genghis and host of Marco Polo)** moved the imperial capital to **Beijing (Yuan Dynasty)**. In the afternoon, we will visit the **Khushuu Tsaidam Memorials** in the Orkhon Valley, erected in honour of Turkic princes **Bilge Khan and Kul Tigin (8th century)**, with **Orkhon inscriptions** considered the most impressive monuments of **the Göktürk Empire**. Later, we will depart to **Lake Ugii**, a paradise for migratory birds during April, May, and summer. These 25 km/16-mile-wide valleys is also home to herds of yaks, sheep, horses, and cattle. We will visit a small museum dedicated to the local flora and fauna, with opportunities for birdwatching. **Return to Karakorum**. We will then continue to the **Elsen Tasarkhai Dunes** (also known as the **Bayangobi Desert**), stretching 80 km/50 miles through a picturesque valley. Here we will hike, climb the dunes, photograph the **landscapes**, and **enjoy an included camel trek across the golden sands**.

Much of the Mongolian population remains nomadic, moving across the land with their Gers and herds of livestock. Encounters with these families and their way of life are an unforgettable experience. **To fully appreciate this journey, travellers must embrace the conditions of Mongolia, set aside preconceived expectations, and remain open to all that this country can offer.**

BRIEF ITINERARY:

B–Breakfast, **L**–Lunch, **D**–Dinner

Day 1: Arrival in Ulaanbaatar (**UBN**)/Meet **Samar Magic Tours** team at the reception of the New "Genghis" Khan Airport. Transfer to hotel (52 km/32.3 miles, approx. **2-3** hours' drive, depending on traffic). For clients arriving in Ulaanbaatar on **OM138 (Mongolia Airlines)** from **FRAN (Frankfurt, Germany)** at **05:10AM** or on **TK236 (Turkish Airlines)** from **IST (Istanbul, Turkey)** at **07:10AM**, an early check-in **must be pre-paid in advance (early entry to hotel rooms)**. Rooms are available only from **02:00PM (14:00)** on the day of arrival. **Today there are no activities and no meals included. Rest at the hotel to adapt to local time.** Selected Hotel.

Day 2: 09:00AM–Meet **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception/Grand City Tour in Ulaanbaatar/Welcome Lunch/**06:00PM**–Mongolian National Concert. Selected Hotel. **(B)(L)**

Day 3: Ulaanbaatar/Genghis Khan Equestrian Statue/Gorkhi-Terelj National Park/Ulaanbaatar. Selected Hotel. **(B)(L)**

Day 4: Ulaanbaatar/Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show/Ulaanbaatar. Selected Hotel. **(B)(L)**

Day 5: Ulaanbaatar/Karakorum. Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**

Day 6: Monument to the Mongolian States/Erdene Zuu Monastery/Karakorum Museum/Orkhon Valley/Turkic Memorials/Ugii Lake/Karakorum. Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**

Day 7: Karakorum/Bayangobi Desert/Excursion on Bactrian Camels/Ulaanbaatar. Selected Hotel. **(B)(L)**

ITINERARY IN DETAILS:

DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN ULANBAATAR/FREE DAY TO GET ACCOMMODATED TO YOUR SCHEDULE

Upon your arrival at the New ``Genghis`` Khan Airport in Ulaanbaatar, the capital of Mongolia, greet by the **Samar Magic Tours** team. **Exchange money at the airport banks.** Transfer to the hotel (52 km/32.3 miles, **+2-3** hours travel time, depending on traffic). ***Rooms can be used from 2:00 PM on the day of arrival. An early check-in fee is required if tourists wish to check in early or leave their luggage at the hotel reception until 2:00 PM. Rest at the hotel to adjust to local time. There are no activities and no meals today.** Overnight at the selected hotel.

DAY 2: GRAND TOUR OF ULANBAATAR/WELCOME LUNCH

Breakfast and Welcome Lunch

Breakfast. **9:00 AM** - Meet with the **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception. **Panoramic tour of Ulaanbaatar:** We will visit **the highest and most important Buddhist Monastery in Mongolia, Gandan**, which houses a **25-meter-high Buddha. Gandan Monastery** was founded in 1809 as the Yellow Temple. The Monastery houses a library with the Gandjuur Buddhist scriptures (8 volumes), their commentaries (225 volumes), and other scriptures using the nine precious stones. It was declared a **State Heritage Site** in 1994. **10:00 AM** - **Here there is an opportunity to attend a Buddhist ceremony. Next, we will visit the Dinosaurs Museum. Nicolas Cage** agreed to return a rare dinosaur skull to the Mongolian government. The Oscar-winning actor purchased the Tyrannosaurus bataar skull in 2007, unaware it had been stolen. Authorities said he

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voluntarily agreed to hand over the skull after learning of the circumstances. The museum also includes examples of Velociraptor and Protoceratops, and a nest of Oviraptor eggs. Visits include the **Mongolian History Museum**, with a rich collection of historical and cultural artifacts from the Stone Age to the present day, **Sukhbaatar Central Square**, and **the Genghis Khan Monument Complex**, built in 2006 to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the founding of the Mongol State or Mongol Empire by ``Genghis`` Khan (1206–2006) and located across from the Mongolian Parliament and Government House. **1:00 PM - Welcome lunch included at a traditional local restaurant.** Transfer to hotel. Accommodation at the selected hotel. **Dinner not included, at your own expense.**



DAY 3: ULAANBAATAR/EQUESTRIAN STATUE OF GENGHIS KHAN/GORKHI-TERELJ NATIONAL PARK/ULAANBAATAR

Breakfast and Lunch

Breakfast. **8:00 AM** - Meet the **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception. Departure for the excursion heading **N/E** to the **Great Equestrian Statue of ``Genghis`` Khan** (55 km / 34.2 miles, +2.0 hours travel time, depending on traffic at departure). Part of the ``Genghis`` Khan Sculpture Complex, this is a 40-meter-high statue of Genghis Khan on horseback, on the banks of the Tuul River. The statue symbolically points east, toward his birthplace. At the base of the sculpture complex is a 10-meter-high visitor center with 36 columns representing the 36 khans of ``Genghis`` Khan and the Ligdan Khan dynasty.

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Designed by sculptor D. Erdenebileg and architect J. Enkhjargal, **it was inaugurated in 2008**. Visitors can access the horse's head, through its chest and neck, for a panoramic view. We will visit a museum integrated into the complex, showing exhibits related to the Bronze Age and archaeological cultures of the Xiongnu of Mongolia, highlighting everyday utensils, belt buckles, knives, sacred animals, etc.; and a second exhibition on the Great Khan period of the 13th and 14th centuries, showcasing ancient tools, goldsmithing, and some Nestorian crosses and rosaries. **At this location, you can rent horses and camels with local guides, and you can also take photos with the golden eagles and Kazakhs** (***additional payment on-site, directly to the locals**). Then, depart for **Gorkhi/Terelj National Park** (50 km / 31.1 miles, 1 hour), located in **the northeast at 1,600 meters** above sea level, with high Mesozoic granite rocks, mountains, steppes, alpine forests, and large Mesozoic rock formations with curious shapes, such as **Turtle Rock**. **Declared a National Park in 1993**, it covers an area of 300,000 hectares. **Stop for photos, souvenir shopping, and hiking to the Great Turtle Rock, the symbol of Gorkhi/Terelj National Park. Gentle hike to the Arryabal Meditation Temple**, located on a hill. **Then, return to Ulaanbaatar** (70 km/44 miles, +2 hours travel time, depending on traffic at the entrance). Transfer to hotel. Accommodation at the selected hotel. **Dinner not included, at your own expense.**

DAY 4: ULAANBAATAR/AUTHENTIC MONGOLIAN NOMADIC SHOW /ULAANBAATAR

Breakfast and Lunch

Breakfast. **7:00 AM** - Meet with the **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception. Then, **depart west** for an **Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show** (35 km/22 miles, +2.00 hours travel time, depending on traffic at departure), from **10:00 AM to 1:00 PM**. The **Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show** demonstrates the traditional lifestyle of Mongolian nomads, raising and using five types of livestock while moving from one place to another using oxcarts, yaks, camels, and horses. We can also observe what a Ger looks like. The Mongolian Ger, **one of the symbols of Mongolia**, is traditionally made. All furniture, pots, and clothing are antiques, reflecting the characteristics and manners of the central Khalks. **Mongolian lunch is included on-site. Return to Ulaanbaatar**(35 km/22 miles, +2 hours travel time, depending on traffic at the entrance). Transfer to the hotel. Overnight at your selected hotel. **Dinner not included, at your own expense.**



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DAY 5: ULAANBAATAR/KARAKORUM (CENTRAL MONGOLIA)

Full Board

Breakfast. **10:00AM**-Meeting with **Samar Magic Tours** team. **Shopping for mineral water and other products at the main store (State Department Store)**. **Departure westward** to legendary **Karakorum** (approx. 395 km/245 miles, 6-7 hours' drive) in **Central Mongolia**. **1:00PM-Lunch is included in route at LUN**. Arrival and transfer. **Free time to rest after a long journey**. Accommodation at tourist Gers camp in Karakorum. **(B)(L)(D)**

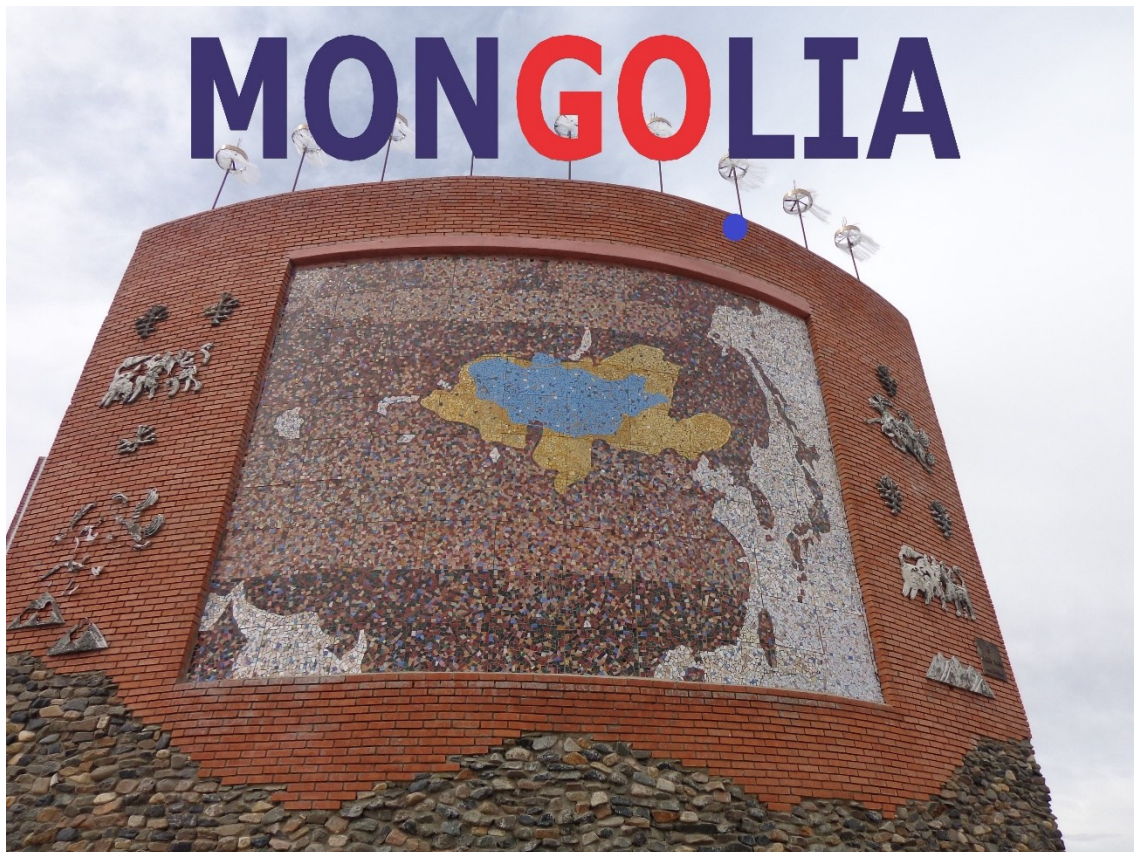


DAY 6: MONUMENT TO MONGOLIAN STATES/ ERDENE ZUU MONASTERY /KARAKORUM MUSEUM / MONUMENTS / ORKHON VALLEY/ TURKISH MEMORIALS /LAKE UGII/KARAKORUM

Full Board

Breakfast. **9:00 AM** - Meet with the **Samar Magic Tours** team. Next, we will **visit the Monument to the Mongol States**, located on a hill overlooking the city of Karakorum (Kharkhorin), on the banks of the Orkhon River. It was built in 2004. The monument consists of a large pile of stones (**a shamanic oboo**) carefully assembled in a cone shape, roughly the size of a teepee, with nine poles protruding from the top. This structure is mounted on a stone and concrete platform and is surrounded by three walls representing three sections of a circle. The outer sides of these walls feature three colorful mosaics depicting three maps, one for each of the empires.

1. **Xiongnu Empire**, a confederation of nomadic tribes who lived on the steppes from approximately the 3rd century BC to the 1st century AD.
2. Next came **the Turkic Khaganate**, established by the Göktürks in 682 and lasting only until 744.
3. Finally, and famously, **‘Genghis’ Khan** founded **the Mongol Empire** of the 13th and 14th centuries.



The iconic place of the Mongol Empire in culture, combined with the shamanic symbolism of the ovoos at the center of the monument, prompts people to leave offerings of vodka, milk, tea, rice, and other edible delicacies that inevitably attract birds and the occasional passing herd of goats and sheep. Several animal skulls can also be found around the monument, completing the surreal scene. It is no coincidence that **the Imperial Map Monument** is located in **Kharkhorin**, as **this city (then called Karakorum) was the capital of the Mongol Empire** under **Genghis Khan's successor, Ogedei Khan**. **The Imperial Map Monument** is a great vantage point from which to gaze **over the city of Kharkhorin and the Orkhon River**, and imagine what this collection of dirt roads and low-rise buildings may have looked like in its glory days. **Next, visit the Erdene Zuu (Hundred Treasures) Monastery, the Turtle Monument, and the Karakoram Museum** to see the relics of the ancient capital of the **Mongol Empire**. The **Erdene Zuu Buddhist Monastery**, with its **108 stupas** and **the first Buddhist lamasery (16th century)**, was the most important religious center. Today it is an impressive sight, with its walls, stupas and temples, occupying an area of **400 square meters**, and surrounded by the steppe. The construction was continued by his **son 'Ogedei' Khan**, after his death. After 40 years, **'Kublai Khan' (grandson of Genghis Khan and host of Marco Polo)** moved the capital of the Mongolian Empire to **Beijing (Peking-Yuan Dynasty)**, already invaded. By

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1792, 62 temples and more than 10,000 Lamas remained. In 1930, Stalinist purges destroyed most of the temples, and the Lamas were exiled to die in Siberia. Of its more than one hundred temples, **only three have survived to our era; this remains Mongolia's most notable cultural vestige. 1:00 PM - Mongolian lunch included in front the Erdene zuu Monastery.**



Then, departure by paved road (46.4 km/29 miles, financed by the Turkish Government) to the Khushuu Tsaidam Memorial Museum in the Orkhon River Valley, erected in honor of the early 8th century Turkish princes Bilge Khan and Kul Tigin with their Orkhon inscriptions, which are admittedly the most impressive monuments of the nomads of the Gokturk Empire. Then, departure by embankment (*hard road) to Lake Ugi (33 km/21 miles, 1 hour drive) - a suitable place for migratory birds. These are cited in this area in late April, May and throughout the summer. Over 25 km/16 miles in a beautiful valley, where herds of yaks, sheep, horses, bulls, etc. graze. We will visit a small museum of the local flora and fauna. Here there are opportunities for ornithological observation. Return to the Karakorum (80 km/50 miles, 2.0 hours). Overnight stay at a Gers tourist camp in the Karakorum.



DAY 7: KARAKORUM/BAYANGOBI DESERT/BACTRIAN CAMEL RIDING EXCURSION /ULAANBAATAR

Breakfast and Lunch

Breakfast. **9:00 AM** - Meet with the **Samar Magic Tours** team. Then, depart for the **Elsen Tasarkhai Dunes** (known as the **Bayangobi desert**, approx. 115 km/72 miles, +2 hours' drive). These desert sand dunes stretch for 80 km/50 miles in a beautiful valley. Opportunities include hiking, dune walking, and landscape photography. **Bactrian camel riding excursion included. Return to Ulaanbaatar** (approx. 280 km/174 miles, +5 hours, depending on traffic at the entrance). **1:00 PM - Lunch is included in LUN.** Arrival and transfer to the hotel. Overnight stay at the selected and confirmed hotel. **Dinner not included, at your own expense.**



DAY 8: ULAANBAATAR TOUR/LAST SHOPPING

Breakfast and Lunch

Breakfast. **9:00 AM** - Meet with the **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception. Next, we will visit **the new "Genghis" Khan Museum ("Chinggis" Khaan)**, which finally opened on **October 11, 2022**. The museum is designed to showcase the history of the Mongolian kings from the reign of King Hunnu Modun Shanyu to the abdication of the Eighth Jebtsundamba. **Final shopping for pure Mongolian cashmere at the cashmere factory store.** Next, we will visit **Zaisan Hill**, which offers an overview of Ulaanbaatar. Next, we will visit **the Golden Buddha statue**, located at the base of the 75-foot-high (23-meter-high) **Zaisan Memorial**. **1:00 PM - Lunch is included at a local restaurant.** Transfer to the hotel. Overnight at the selected hotel. **Dinner at your own expense.**

DAY 9: DEPARTURE FROM MONGOLIA

Breakfast

Breakfast. Rooms must be vacated by **12 noon** on the day of departure. Meet with the **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception. Transfer to the New ``Genghis`` Khan Airport (52 km/32.3 miles, **+4-5** hours travel time, depending on traffic). **Departure from Mongolia. END OF THE GREAT TRIP.**

- Meals as specified (**8B,7L,2D**) with 1 bottle of mineral water daily.
- All private transfers by tourist bus or van (***depending on the confirmed group**) in Ulaanbaatar, Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show, and Gorkhi/Terelj National Park, with all fuel included.
- All private transfers by comfortable Japanese vehicle or similar, with all fuel included, in the remainder of the trip. **Samar Magic Tours** reserves the right to change the vehicle according to the number of participants; in no case will we accept claims for this reason, and no refunds will apply.
- English/Spanish-speaking local guide.
- All entrance fees to Gorkhi/Terelj National Park, Arryabal Meditation Temple, the Great Genghis Khan Equestrian Statue, Karakorum, monuments, museums, and monasteries.
- Attendance at a folklore show featuring the fascinating sounds of khoomi throat singing and Mongolian dance.
- Admission to an Authentic Mongolian Nomadic Show.
- Experience and knowledge about the true nomadic life.
- Excursion on Bactrian camels through the Bayangobi Desert sand dunes.
- Light hiking through wonderful landscapes.
- Birdwatching at Ugii Lake.
- Service fees include 10% VAT, 2% Ulaanbaatar city tax, and 5% service charge in Ulaanbaatar city hotels.

- Visit the Museum of the Turkic Memorials (Khushuu Tsaidam) in the Orkhon River Valley, erected in honor of the early 8th-century Turkic princes Bilge Khan and Kul Tigin with their Orkhon inscriptions, considered the most impressive monuments of the Göktürk Empire nomads.
- Explore Ugii Lake – an appropriate site for migratory birds, cited in this area at the end of April, May, and throughout the summer, with more than 25 km/16 miles in a beautiful valley where herds of yaks, sheep, horses, bulls, etc., graze. Visit a small local flora and fauna museum. Birdwatching opportunities are available here.
- Ride Bactrian camels across the sand dunes.

An occasional encounter with one of these families and their way of life is an unforgettable experience. **To enjoy the trip, travellers must accept these conditions in advance, let go of preconceived notions about how things "should" be, and remain open to what this country has to offer.**



FORCE MAJEURE CONDITIONS: While it is our absolute desire to carry out the trip as detailed in the program, on occasion there may be force majeure circumstances that require modifications. **Samar Magic Tours** is not legally responsible for those force majeure situations beyond the organization's control that may force changes to the travel program. FACT SHEET OF MONGOLIA

Currency: The official currency in Mongolia is the Tugrik or Tugrug (T). It comes in banknotes of 10, 20, 50, 100, 500, 1,000, 5,000, 10,000, and 20,000 Tugrik. It is advisable to bring EUROS or USD and exchange them progressively. Currency exchange can be done at banks and hotels in Ulaanbaatar.

Climate: Known as the land of the blue sky, but its climate is extreme and severe. Siberian winters cover the Gobi Desert with snow until April and keep lakes frozen until May. The rainy season is short, from mid-**July to September**, with brief and light showers. Nights are cool even in summer.

Approximate temperatures in Mongolia:

Spring:	May	[around 14°C daytime, 6° °C nighttime. Occasional rain, generally cool.]
Summer:	June-August	[28–30 °C daytime, 18 °C nighttime. Mostly dry with occasional rain.]
Autumn:	September.	[21–16 °C daytime, 0 °C nighttime. Dry and cold.]

Luggage: The lighter the luggage, the better. A soft backpack or travel bag is recommended, plus a small daypack for essentials during the day (camera, skin and lip cream, binoculars, canteen, and flashlight). A raincoat or poncho and a good parka, warm clothes for high places, light cotton clothes, sunglasses, and a cap for midday heat, as well as comfortable footwear, are recommended. Clients are advised to bring binoculars.

Small first-aid kit: mosquito repellent, saline solution, gauze, aspirin, paracetamol.

Electricity: 220V, 50Hz. European round plug.

Clothing: No special requirements regarding dress, just respect local customs.

Photography: The country is one of the most photogenic in the world, with its landscapes, wildlife, culture, and people. Entrance fees to museums, National Parks, and Monasteries are included in the trip according to the program, but photography is not. In many monasteries and temples, photos are not allowed unless you pay the set fee. Always check before taking photos, as notices are written in Cyrillic or Mongolian, often unintelligible for us; once you take a picture, payment is immediate.



Food: The basis of food in **Mongolia** is meat. Lamb and flour form the base of most meals. The Mongolian diet also includes horse meat. Milk and yogurt have an exquisite though strong flavor. Cow and goat cheese are common. Milk may not be pasteurized, and some dairy products can therefore be unsafe. It should be boiled, and foods should preferably be consumed cooked. This is the health guideline, but in reality, once you stop at a Ger, guests are always invited to enter and offered aromatic *airag* (fermented mare's milk) and goat, yak, or sheep cheese, all acidic and dry. Refusing would not be polite.

Shopping: Bargaining is not common in Mongolia. Even bargaining, you won't usually pay less than 70% of the asking price. Some shops offer handicrafts, postcards, and clothing. Also available are carpets, leather and fur products, as well as cashmere and camel hair items. Wooden toys, puzzles, and games, along with oil paintings and watercolors. In the capital's stores, European products are available—expensive, especially in the State Department Store and other new shopping centers—which carry almost anything you may want, both Mongolian and foreign.

Precautions: Mongolia is a safe place for tourism; there are no drugs, assaults, or weapons. However, as anywhere in the world, one must be cautious with pickpockets.

It is recommended that upon arrival at the hotel you immediately place in the hotel safe (in the room or at reception): passport, visas, money, documents, valuables, etc., before going out for visits in Ulaanbaatar. Be careful in restaurants, pizzerias, cafés, markets, the central post office, and monasteries, where there are pickpockets.
